

## HEALTHY COOKING WITH KIDS



### Ingredients

1 cup self-raising flour  
1tbs Continental Chicken Stock Powder  
2 Eggs  
1/2 cup milk  
420g corn kernels



### Method

Place flour and stock powder in a large mixing bowl and make a well in the centre

Using a fork, mix in eggs and milk. Add corn and chives, stir well until combined.

Heat a little oil in a non-stick pan and drop 1/4 cup of the fritter mixture into the pan.

Cook for 1-2 minutes, each side, until golden and cooked through. Repeat with remaining mixture.

**NOTE** Add other vegetables such as grated zucchini, carrot and diced capsicum for extra goodness.


